Impact: Provides 50 million people in sub-Saharan Africa with access to power.



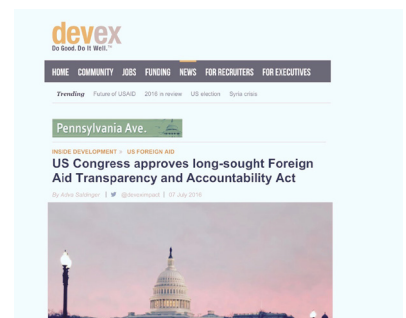
GLOBAL FOOD SECURITY ACT

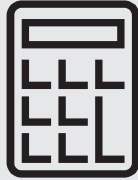
